RMAC announces new CEO

The Red Meat Advisory Council Board has announced the appointment of Mr Reith Parker as the new Chief Executive Officer for RMAC.



Mr Parker has most recently been an Advisor to the Queensland Office of the Leader of the Opposition; a role requiring extensive stakeholder engagement and industry relationship management.

Prior to this Mr Parker gained experience in economics, trade and industry affairs with Sheep Producers Australia. He also has an academic background in agriculture, focussed on regulatory risk in ruminant livestock industries.

New NVDs now in effect

Feedlots are reminded that livestock now cannot be sold without the most up to date National Vendor Declaration (NVD) forms. As of 1 January 2021, only the updated versions of all NVDs (0720) will be accepted for cattle, sheep and goats. There is no cost for the new NVD books until 30 June 2021.

LPA accredited producers, feedlots and value chain stakeholders who use the eNVD platform can automatically access the updated versions.

To support feedlots in identifying the early signs of heatload and suitable management practices to combat heatload events, ALFA has developed a *Guide: Managing Summer Heat in Australian Feedlots*.

Have you checked your weather station recently?

It's a good time to think about any maintenance that your weather station may require. Some key points are listed below, and full notes by Katestone are available by clicking here.

- Keep the sensors clean: leaves, spider webs, etc. can obstruct ventilation. If you have a black globe temperature sensor (black metal sphere), other foreign enemies (like dust, mud, bird dropping) can have a negative impact.
- Check that wind sensors (the cups and vane) do not make any noise when spinning.
- Use desiccant to remove condensation from the air inside enclosures (mast, booms, electrical cable, and connectors).
- Check the battery (it should be close to the nominal battery voltage that is stamped on the battery case)
- Inspect the solar panel cover for cracking or crazing, leakage of rain around the edges and dirt.

LPA NVDs

Updated versions of LPA NVDs for all species, were released on 1 July 2020 – identified by version number 0720. This is now the 'current' version

From 1 Jan 2021 – ONLY the current version will be accepted

Moving livestock with non-current LPA NVDs is a breach of LPA Rules and Standards and could affect your accreditation. You must be LPA accredited to be able to access LPA NVDs

eNVD. The faster, easier way to complete livestock consignments. The eNVD system always has the current LPA NVD version and is available online in your LPA account at **lpa.nlis.com.au**

If you need help accessing the eNVD, please contact the ISC Helpdesk on 1800 683 111

Be prepared. If you wish to use a LPA NVD book make sure you order your new book well in advance, otherwise use the eNVD

Due to high order volumes and postage delays, there is a 6-week turn-a-round for hard copy book orders. Remember to use eNVD if needed.

Need an LPA NVD in a hurry?

From 1 Jan 2021, only current LPA NVDs (version 0720) are accepted. If you need a current LPA NVD immediately, you will need to generate an eNVD.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Your LPA account login details*

Access to a smart phone, mobile device or computer with internet access *

To create an eNVD yourself. Go to the LPA Service Centre at **Ipa.nlis.com.au** Your agent may be able to assist you, but cannot complete the eNVD for you.

YOU NEED TO:

Complete ALL sections online and submit digitally OR

Click submit and generate a PDF copy to be printed and filled in manually. Don't forget you will need 3 copies (yours, transporters and receivers) and all must be clear, correct and complete.
